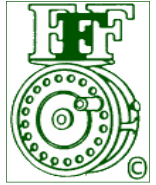

Saturday April 10, 2010 was a below freezing windy morning on Amber Lake, but six or seven brave souls from the Spokane Fly Fishers immersed their bodies in the water in pursuit of the elusive Rainbow or Cut Throat Trout. Only the best or the luckiest fisher was successful on this blustery day and bag limits were smaller than usual but size was not as 19 and 20 inch fish were reported. Fish were taken at both ends of the lake.



If you let the wind dictate where you fished you were in the shallow weed beds where you normally were being blown out of, but the fish were there amidst the lily pads if you used the right fly and could keep your kick boat from blowing over your fly. For those strong enough, or stubborn enough to make the long pull to the opposite end, there were fish there also waiting to give you a ride before the wind sent you home. All but one or two were off the lake early that day, looking for coffee or a warm fire and dreaming of the one that got away.

Well Gals, I got to spend the weekend fishing with a lot of great guys! We had a lot of fun but had to work really hard to get the fish.

Chris and I fished in gale on Friday, you know a little snow, hail, rain and 30 mile an hour wind. BOY, were we tried, but we managed to catch a few fish, 4 nice bull trout among them, Chris caught 3 of them.

The skwala showed up on Saturday, but the fish were not really keying in on them, we also saw blue wing olives, march browns, midges and a small olive stone. I don't know what was wrong with the fish, too much food in the water I guess! Saw a few pods of fish keying on the blue wings and the march browns, an extended body BWO (16) and a Brooks Spout (18) worked really well for me. We met for dinner at the OK Café to chow down and swap a few stories.

Sunday, we saw almost no hatches, so everyone went deep, a brown griddle bug and a 2 bead stonefly nymph caught a few fish. The fly that worked the best for me was a Prince Nymph (16); I terrorized the white fish population with it and caught one beautiful 20 inch Cutthroat.

GEORGETOWN LAKE OUTING—JULY 9TH, 10TH AND 11TH

I know it may seem a bit early since the trip to Georgetown Lake is July 9, 10, 11 but reservations for a campsite need to be made soon as this campground will fill up! Reservations need to be made through ReserveUSA. If you are a computer geek you can make reservations online beginning at this link <http://www.reserveusa.com/jsp/commonpage.jsp?goto=/nrrs/mt/pbcg/newindex.html> and just following directions. The fee is \$13.00 per day plus the reservation fee. Here is some reservation info:

You will be able to search by state or facility name and also check availability as one of the many functions available. The NRRS can also be contacted through TDD [1-877-833-6777](tel:1-877-833-6777) and International (518) 885-3639.

Hours of Operation: April 1 through Labor Day: 8:00 a.m. until midnight EST Mon-Fri 8:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. EST Sat-Sun. Day after Labor Day through March 31: 10:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. EST Mon-Fri 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. EST Sat-Sun

Making a Reservation: When calling to make a reservation, you will be asked to provide the following information:

Campground name (or state) Philipsburg Bay Campground, Montana

Arrival and departure dates

Type of site required (tent, RV, cabin, lookout, etc.)

The number of people in your party

Method of payment (certified check, credit card -Visa, MasterCard, Amex, Discover card)

This trip has been in the past, and is still, planned to be loosely organized. There are no meals etc. planned, just a good time and maybe good fishing!

Damsel Fly adults and nymphs are the “fly of the day” with a Goddard Caddis sometimes successful as a traveling sedge imitation. Heavy leader and tippet should be in your supplies as there are a lot of weeds and sometimes a good sized fish!

SPOKANE RIVER OUTING - JULY 17TH

If you have not floated and fished the Spokane River, come see a scenic part of Spokane you did not know existed. For those of you who have, you know why you don't want to miss this outing.

We will meet at Water street underneath the Maple street bridge at 8:30 A.M.. We will set up our boats and the shuttle vehicles to the T. j. Meenach take out. If you want to walk and wade but don't know the hot spots, call and we will fine someone to put you in the know. We will call every one on the sign up list prior to the outing to update information for fishing on the river.

KELLY CREEK OUTING - JULY 24-25

The 2010 Kelly Creek fishing outing promises to be one to remember. Kelly Forks CC is located at the confluence of the North Fork of the Clearwater and Kelly Creek (as in Blue Ribbon Idaho Cutthroats). This is about as far from civilization as you can get in the lower 48, but far from primitive. Kelly Forks CC has many water front campsites and plenty of nice toilets and running water. The fishing can be fantastic right out your front door on either Kelly Creek or the North Fork. Last year we had more luck and larger fish on the NF but Kelly was also very productive. Water flows in the later summer make wading easy and the Cuts are looking up for big ugly patterns like a Turks or Grasshopper. Your hosts Mark Potter and Paul Pimentel will provide a mountain man Dutch oven breakfast on Saturday morning and possibly some whiskey infused music that night.

We come through Superior MT, up and over Hoo Doo Pass (ID and MT) and follow the NF or the signs to Kelly Creek then meet at the confluence of both rivers. You can also get there via Pierce, ID. Check your local map or fishing shop for more specific directions and fill up with gas before you leave civilization.

If you love to fish for huge, easy to catch Cutt's and Bow's, in one of the most beautiful western rivers, this is your trip.

ST. JOE OUTING - AUGUST 7th & 8th

Hosts: Art and Clara Ross



We look forward to seeing all of you at our Outing on the "Joe". We will be camping at Fly Flat Camp Ground, 3 miles up the Upper River Road. There is a chance the campground will be full. In that case, we will camp at the Big Meadow, milepost 1.5. Look for the SFF Banner. Both camping areas have "damn fine outhouses". And Fly Flat has an old fashion water pump. The water is safe but tends to be rusty and cloudy. There are tent spaces and nice back-ins for medium sized trailers.

For those not familiar with the area, there are two routes to choose from. From St. Maries, ID, travel 80 miles further up the River to the campsite. Turn off of the main highway just past mile marker 76, then 3 more miles to the campground. The other route is over I-90 to St. Regis, MT. Turn left at the 4-way stop and drive 1 mile to Little Joe Road, turning left, go up and over the mountain 28 miles to the river, then left for 3 miles. The Montana side of this pass is gravel and can be very wash-boardy, and has been responsible for damaged mirrors and thrashed trailer interiors. It is highly recommended that you get gas in either St. Maries or St. Regis. Idaho Fishing Licenses are available in both towns. St. Regis is about 1 hour from the campground for those who might like a shower, some groceries, or an opportunity to hit one of the antique stores.



The "Joe" is a very fine cutthroat fishery, with fish ranging from 8 - 18 inches. You'll always have great luck with Caddis patterns and also do very well as Comparaduns, Tan and Olive working well. Fish a Stimulator or Turks Tarantula with a small Nymph dropper and swing Soft Hackles towards during the evening. Don't overlook Hoppers, Ants, and Bees! This is a great chance for the novice fisher, as cuts are always hungry and we will have plenty of "experts" available. It is a relatively easy river for wading and it should be warm enough for those who do not have fancy breathables yet.

Dinner Saturday evening is a Dutch oven dinner but we would like A-F to bring salads , G-N desserts and O-Z side dishes. We realize with this being a bit more remote outing that this might not work for all. Give Art or Clara Ross a call if you have any questions at 226-9924.
